

The Historical Connection

 Spices a precious commodity attracted many foreign merchants to the shores of India

 To keep the trade route to India open, it is believed that many wars have been fought



The Historical Connection


- In 1494 AD Vasco Da Gamma, in search of new route to the Spices Land, arrived near Calicut in Kerala
- This visit led to major spices trading
- Spice trade became one of the attractions for subsequent invasion by various European countries



Present Scenario

- Kerala has not looked back, ever since Vasco Da Gamma's time
- Since Independence, Kerala has been a major exporter of Spices, Cashews, Marine Products, Tea, Coffee etc
- Kerala accounts for nearly 20 % of country's food exports
- Kerala has been the base from where spices, cashew and marine export industries spread to other parts of the country

 Kerala would continue to be the leader state in the future innovative initiatives




Kerala's Perspective

Kerala The Plus Factors

Agricultural Resources

- Known as God's own country because of its green carpet like vegetation
- Has rich agricultural biodiversity



Kerala The Plus Factors

Agricultural Resources

- Major producer of spices contributing to 97% of country's pepper production
- Kerala accounts for 70% of cocoa production and 25% of country's coffee
- Kerala accounts for 16% of cashew production and 35% of cashew nut processing units
- About 42% of coconut produced in the State



Kerala The Plus Factors

Agricultural Resources – unique varieties

- Nendran banana is special to Kerala and is being exported in big quantities
- Mauritius pineapple is a local variety for which Kerala meets the entire needs of South India and part of North India
- <u>Navarra rice</u> is a specialty rice having very high nutritive and medicinal properties



Kerala The Plus Factors

Infrastructure - Land Connectivity

- Well connected and integrated <u>road network</u> within the State
- <u>Urban-rural divide</u> very thin
- Facilitates <u>easier penetration</u> into the market



Kerala The Plus Factors

Infrastructure - Air Connectivity

- Three well spread international airports
- Fourth international airport at Kannur getting ready
- Considering the small size of the State, <u>an excellent</u> infrastructure for export activity



Kerala The Plus Factors

Infrastructure – Sea Connectivity

- All weather seaport at Kochi
- Strategic location on the <u>trans-national trade corridor</u>
- Modern Container Terminal with excellent container handling facility
- New seaport at Vizhinjam near Trivandrum coming up



Kerala The Plus Factors

Kerala a Resourceful Market

- Equivalent to a 'Metro City' with thin rural urban divide
- · With highest per capita expenditure on food in the country
- · High level of urbanization. Well developed mature markets.



Kerala The Plus Factors

Kerala a Resourceful Market

- High purchasing power boosted mainly by repatriation from sizeable non resident Keralites
- High level of literacy with high proportion of working women
- <u>Supermarket culture</u> a predominant trend

- Kerala well known for its <u>cent percent literacy</u>
- Food Processing is no exception in this respect

First to set up Film & Video Park for Entertainment Industry


First to set up Apparel Park for the Garment Industry

KINFRA is the <u>State Nodal Agency</u> for Ministry of Food Processing Industries (MFPI), Govt. of India for administration of all its schemes.


The main trust of MFPI schemes is to create sufficient infrastructure for Food Processing Industry.





KINFRA Food Processing Park, Kakkancherry

- * Located about 25 kms from Calicut city
- * Adjacent to Calicut International Airport
- * On the Calicut-Trichur National Highway
- * 30 Acre plot
- * Fully developed and operational
